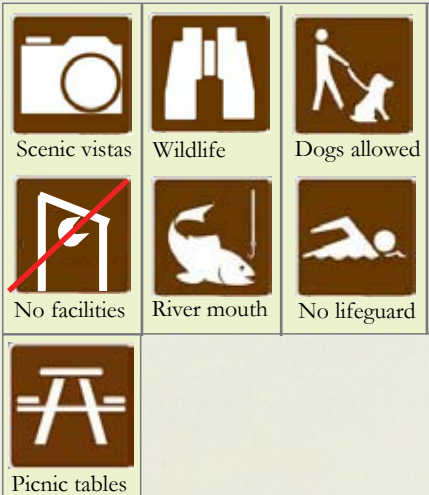


Mayes Landing

Burlington, Vermont



On a clear October day Meg is out on the Burlington bike path to enjoy the remaining autumn days. “In the summer I come here regularly on my lunch hour,” she explains. “I get to see a view other than my computer.” The bike path has become the main conduit leading away from fast-paced daily lives, and Mayes Landing is a resting spot just before the bridge where the bike path and the Winooski River meet. Conserved by the Lake Champlain Land Trust, the Winooski Valley Park District, Local Motion, and the Trust for Public Land in 2000, Mayes Landing represents resident’s interests in maintaining open spaces.



Directions and Park Information:

Mayes Landing is located at the north end of the Burlington bike path, on the right when facing the Winooski River. Mayes Landing can be accessed by bike or by boat where the bike path crosses the river, although it is also within walking distance of several bike path parking areas.

The park is managed by the Winooski Valley Park District. Open dawn to dusk. There are no facilities. Mayes Landing is a great resting spot if you kayak or canoe on the lake, or walk, skate or bike on the bike path. Please take out anything you bring with you.
